Let's be Alleluia People!

Over the Easter weekend, we attended a 100-year-old Anglican church on Mayne Island for Sunday service. We were greeted warmly, given a bell to ring (every time the word "alleluia" was spoken), sang songs from hymnals, and read scripture and prayers aloud together. When it came time for the priest to share his message, he opened with a question: "Are we Alleluia people?"

Easter was never meant to be a once-a-year celebration. It is, and ought to be, a way of life for us. The resurrection of Jesus is the most important reality of our faith. Paul says; "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is vain; you are still in your sins." Jesus' resurrection changes everything for us. We are a freed people, and this is reason enough for us to shout "Alleluia!".

N.T. Wright says; "if Lent is a time to give things up, Easter ought to be a time to take things up." Because we have accepted and embraced our salvation, and in doing so have joined with Jesus in living resurrected lives, we ought to embrace Easter so fully that those around us might ask, "What is the meaning of all of this?" We are called to be Light Bearers. Are we shining a light for the world to see? Do our lives look different to the people around us?

And so I ask you; Are you an Alleluia people? Take some time to think on this. Invite the Holy Spirit into this question. Ask Him how you can be a better light bearer to the world. Ask Him what this looks like for you. What is He calling you to do?

Questions to ask yourself this week:

- Are you discouraged or lacking motivation right now? How can you encourage yourself with the truths of the resurrection?
- Identify a brother or sister who can be encouraged by these truths. How will you reach out to them before the week is over?
- Make it a goal to shout "alleluia" in the coming days. Praise is glorifying to Him, especially in the midst
 of our troubles.
- Remind yourself every morning that Jesus Christ is currently risen from the dead, today, just as He was
 on the first Easter Sunday.
- Pray that the Lord would show you how to walk in the victory that Christ has won for you, regardless of the current circumstances of your life.
- Know that Christ is not only risen, but He is ascended to the Father where He is always appealing to God on your behalf. (Rom 8:34)
