



Sermon from Feb. 7 2021: Questions for further reflection

1. If your story were to be written as a book or became a TV show, in what genre would it be classified?
le. drama, comedy, horror, mystery, documentary, reality, etc.
2. In what ways has your story been influenced by things that happened even before you were born?
3. How do you feel about the way your story has gone so far? Are there parts you would like to re-write?
4. What do you think about the idea of co-authoring your story with God from this point forward? What might that look like?
5. Can you think of other times, either in Scripture or church history when God's people have had to change/pivot/adapt?

Overview:

The sermon discussed the concept that in order to achieve our vision of ***Pursuing Jesus in Community*** as his people together, each one of us needs to be committed to such a vision personally in order for that to be accomplished.

1. Did you have a chance to listen to the sermon? Was there anything that was impactful, or encouraging or with which you disagreed?
2. What does it mean to you that our Triune God, the Community of Communities has invited you into community with Him? What are the implications of that for your life?
3. Some Christians believe they can live the Christian life in isolation apart from Community with One Another. What is your response to that? What are the implications for you of the "one anothers" of Scripture?
4. How do you understand "Community **for** the world" to be different than "Community **with** God" and Community **with** One Another"?
5. Do you find it easier to think of this vision as an individual or as a community? Why?
6. Given the challenge of these three aspects of Community, is there one that you feel you need to incorporate more of into your daily living? Which one and why?
